THE GOAL

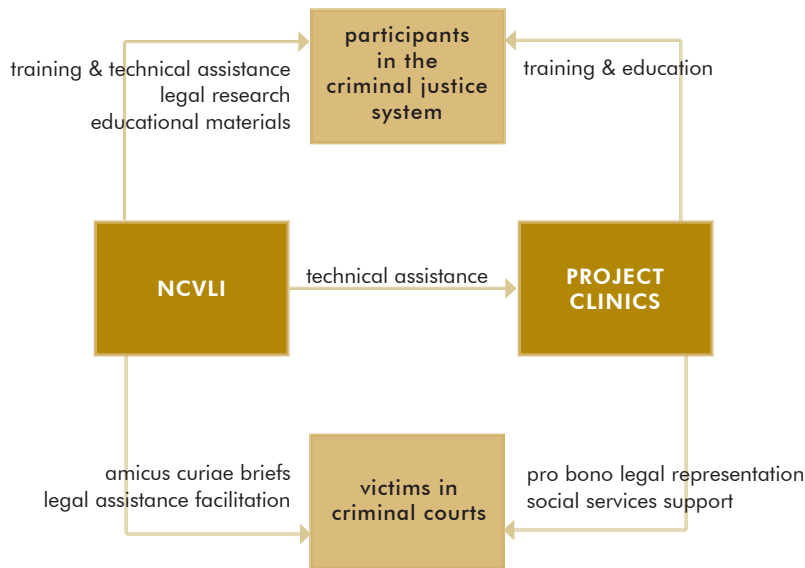
To fill a gap in the criminal justice system by providing free legal representation to victims of crime, amicus curiae participation on important victim issues, and education, training, and assistance to victim attorneys, prosecutors, advocates, and others in the criminal justice system.

THE ORGANIZATION

The National Crime Victim Law Institute (NCVLI), established in 2000, is a non-profit research and educational organization at Lewis & Clark Law School in Portland, Oregon. NCVLI is the only national organization in the country working to assert victims’ rights in criminal trial and appellate courts.

THE PLAN

The Project works to ensure that crime victims have meaningful rights in the criminal justice system and the ability to exercise those rights in trial and appellate courts. To achieve this goal, 8 legal clinics are operated across the country. Project Clinics are located in Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Maryland, New Jersey, New Mexico, South Carolina, and Utah. NCVLI may be able to facilitate legal assistance for victims in other jurisdictions.

The Project Clinics provide direct pro bono legal representation to victims in state, federal and tribal criminal courts. In addition, Project Clinics provide social services support to victims by investigating and coordinating services available both locally and nationally.

To ensure victims’ rights are honored in cases nationwide, NCVLI files amicus curiae briefs on important victims’ rights issues in state and federal cases regardless of Project Clinic participation. NCVLI also provides technical assistance, including legal research and educational material, on victims’ rights to any attorney, advocate, or other participant in the criminal justice system.

The Project, through both NCVLI and Project Clinics, conducts trainings nationwide to educate criminal justice professionals on the scope and meaning of victims’ rights.
