Who are we?

The ARK, Alzheimer's Family Support Services serves families living with Alzheimer's disease and other types of dementia in the Tri-County area, Orangeburg and Colleton Counties in South Carolina. We operate a social respite program in Summerville and opened Loving Hearts Respite Care in Harleyville in 2016. Our family support services include support groups, educational training, seminars, resource fairs, memory screenings, rural outreach, and caregiver consultation. The ARK is a non-sectarian, non-discriminatory, 501 (c)(3) non-profit organization and has been serving the Lowcountry of South Carolina since 1996.

What is The NOAH Project?

The NOAH Project is a community outreach effort to assist small towns and rural communities in developing their own services to help families living with Alzheimer's Disease. Our goal is to create a basic framework of easily accessible community services throughout our coverage area.

How can The NOAH Project assist your community?

The ARK recognizes that each community has its own unique identity, personality, and culture. Residents know their own needs, and are best suited to meet those needs if given the opportunity and the proper tools. The ARK is a catalyst to help your community get started by:
